



Following a very successful 1993 season during which the Lions established a new standard of quality football, it was inevitable that an invitation to participate in the elite 'A' division of the APS would be extended to them. So it was that the Lions found themselves out at Keysborough on Saturday morning lining up against the pick of Haileybury's five Year 8 football sides. With the Lions' 1994 team list already weakened by the salary cap and some underhand off season poaching by the NBL and the Australian Athletics Institute, it was a major blow to lose the on ball strength of Paul Walvisch who had turned his ankle during last weekend's intra-club practice match. Nevertheless the Lions' lineup still looked formidable on paper it was now a matter of measuring up the opposition.

Well, a quick glance on Saturday morning was enough to tell us that they use a different standard of measurement out in the sticks. The ruckmen would not have looked out of place shooting baskets with Shaq O'Neal, and even the rovers were able to look Timmy Krotiris in the eye! Not surprisingly the Lions looked overawed for much of the first quarter as they struggled to come to terms with the extra pressure applied by their humungous opponents. Quarter time was think time, as the Lions refocused and adjusted their

game plan.

The team that took the field for the second term was determined not to play into their opponents hands, and to their credit, the Lions took the game right up to Haileybury. All around the ground players lifted their performance and it showed on the scoreboard as each Haileybury goal was answered by a Wesley major. Led by 'Krackers' Krotiris who was playing a bottler at CHB, and Cam Unsworth's inspirational efforts on the last line of defence, the Lions soon saw the advantage of attacking the ball and making the play! With our newly elected skipper, Hadyn, in fine form and with Ezra doing a good job in the centre, the Lion's opportunities were increasing by the minute. Some

magnificent running on the wing by 'Demon' Davis produced our first goal, and another inspired effort by Adam set up our second as Nick Abbott marked in front of the big sticks. Courageous and skilful play by 'Reds' Prerara provided a great example to his team mates and helped keep the ball moving forward. The backline was keeping the screws on the opposition forwards and the home team were not finding it so easy now! Cookesy, Rosey and 'Teaser' Goldenfein were hassling and harassing their opponents while 'Dasher' Nash was impressing with his strong running from the back pocket. Big Bill Mortimer was competing tirelessly in the ruck and Fryza was firing up, but it was 'Krackers' who was leading the charge with his strong marking and direct play as he continually turned the ball back towards our forward line. Chucky was just cruising around half forward while Muiry, 'Jacka' Jackett, and the Peckster were boldly throwing their bodies into death defying situations. Jonno Dixon was moving well at full forward, but inconsiderate Haileyburians kept smothering his snapshots! At the long break we trailed by 23 points, and the coach was a much happier man!

Although unable to score themselves during the third quarter, the Lions maintained the pressure on the locals and held them to just three more majors. Injuries to Poyas and Abbott suggested that a Lions' victory was now an improbability, but the boys refused to lie down and geared themselves for a real dip in the last quarter. Strong play by Unsa and Nash kept the Haileybury forwards on their toes, and strong marking by the skipper helped lock the ball in our forward line. A pass to Tim, who in turn passed to Fryza produced another Lions' major and Abbo almost secured our fourth. Muiry turned on a great run, tackle and hassle against several steroid affected opponents and Chucky delighted the crowd with his amazing Tai-Kwon-Do torpedo, but the Lions were unable to narrow the margin on the scoreboard, and when the final siren sounded it showed the home team to be comfortable winners. But winning isn't every -thing, and the Lions could walk from the field with their heads high. A gutsy effort and a valuable learning experience.

NOW READ ON...... Having proved to themselves the previous week that they could be competitive against bigger and stronger opposition, the Lions were eager to take on another A Division team to see if they could move closer to their first victory of the new season. A training scare during the week threatened to rob us of last week's B.O.G. Krackers Krotiris, but in true Lion spirit he shrugged off his cut lip and declared himself available for the big match. Tim Rodgers-Wilson returned to the team following his late withdrawal in the opening round, and Peter Johnson was promoted following a strong performance in the Reserves. Poyas also had made a quick recovery from his achilles injury and was able to reclaim his place in the pivot, so the selectors were able to name a strong team for the season's first home match.

It was a still, overcast morning at Albert Park as the match got under way, and very soon it became clear that the Lions would again have a job on their hands! Kicking to the Northern end of the oval, St. Kevins gave our backline plenty to think about during the opening minutes, and the first goals were soon on the board. Once again the Lions seemed overawed by the size of their opponents and were constantly finding themselves second to the ball. With few scoring opportunities for the quarter, our best chance came when Ezra ran the ball into the forward line and Jonno Dixon rushed it towards the goalmouth. Offloaded as he kicked, Jonno could only watch as the ball slewed into the goalpost. Jonno followed the ball and was immediately the centre of attention as the medical staff rushed to his aid. A severe gash to his calf would require stitches and Jonno was rushed to hospital. Chuck took his place at full forward, but had little to do for the remainder of the quarter as Skevvys continued to control the game. Trailing by 32 points at the break, the Lions needed to have a good hard look at themselves. They did just that, and came out a much more determined outfit for the second quarter.

NOW READ ON......In a thrilling, hard fought encounter on Saturday morning at the Wadhurst Oval, the Lions shrugged off the disappointments of previous weeks and emerged triumphant over a disciplined Melbourne Grammar combination.

The lead up to the game had been promising, as Paul "I wanna play ruck" Walvisch passed a fitness test on Friday, and Chuck once again managed to resist the bribes offered him by the 'Bs' supporters group. The first stage of the plan involved the bribing of two highly respected medical specialists who were each offered free membership rights at the prestigious Royal Rosebud Pitch'n'Putt Golf Club, if they would issue false diagnoses to Lion stars Poyas and Goldsmith. It is crunch time for the Lions. Wesley captain, Hadyn Sallman admitted that yesterday's disappoint -ing loss to Xavier had placed his team behind the eight ball. The Lions worked hard to regain their hold on the game, but the Xavier big guns were starting to fire, and it was proving difficult. Fry and Perera were showing their class, and Jackett and Abbott were finding space on the half forward line. Chuck's second goal came courtesy of an Abbott pass, and a third soon followed as clever play from Ranasinghe rebounded a kick in. Mortimer and Krotiris were working tirelessly to neutralise their opponents' impact on the game, but Xavier's confidence was high, and despite the efforts of Elg, Unsworth and Rosenberg, they had moved further ahead by the final change.

Walvisch and Sallman were shifted into defence and Krotiris and Elg moved onto the ball for the Lions' last ditch effort, and although Davis continued his good form on the wing and Walvisch provided plenty of drive, the situation looked grim. Goldenfein and Johnson were using handball to advantage on the forward line, and strong shepherding by Tush enabled Abbott to register his second, and the Lions' final goal, but not even the presence of a Channel 7 camera crew could lift them to victory. Xavier replied and maintained their hold on the game.

NOW READ ON.......Having spent the past two weeks building themselves up for a game against the very beatable Scotch, the Lions were shocked when it was announced during the week that the fixture had been changed. Once again they would be facing St. Kevins - and the Lions knew it would be tough! The selectors had no hesitation including Jonno Dixon in the team this week as a replacement for Pete Johnson who had flown to the States to try out as a kicker with the Disneyland Ducks. In an attempt to counter Skevvy's legend Dynamic Dion, Wally Walvisch was named at CHB, and Krackers was given a ruck roving commission. The Lions knew if they could jump Skevvys early in the game they would be in with a chance.

It was cold and windy as the Lions burst on to the Spaghetti Oval amidst the cheers of Mr. Muir, Mr.Fry, Mrs.Krotiris and someone on the other end of Mr.Rodgers-Wilson's mobile. Kicking to the pavilion end the Lions were quickly into the action and they looked a real chance with Krackers enjoying a bit of a run and Sally and Ezra obviously in good touch. 











# PARSING STARS
