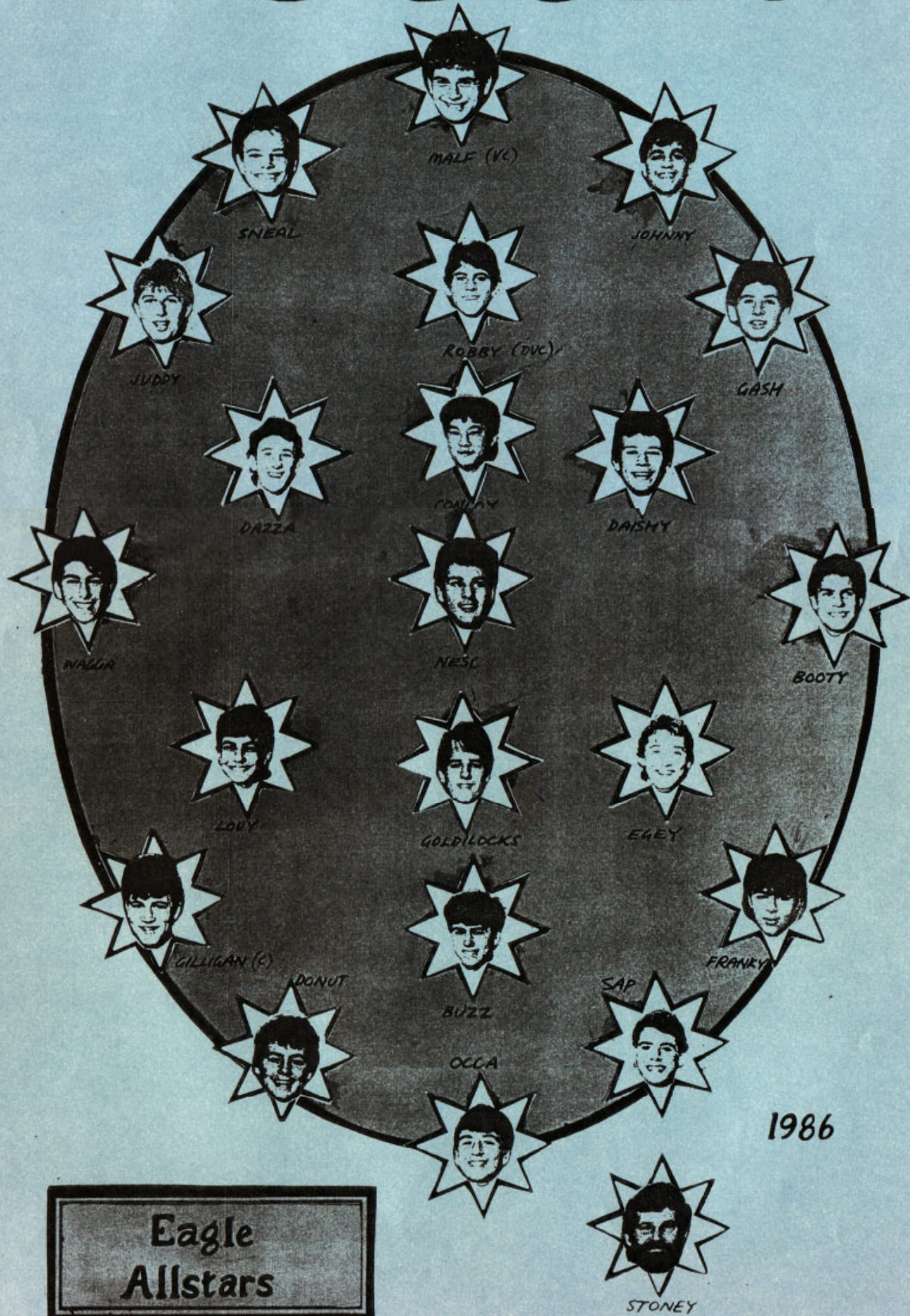

# 15As REPORT

A hectic weekend for the 15As with a pie night, the first AGS round, and a trip to Shepparton for the local version of the World Cup.

The pie night was however the only unqualified success, as our on-field success rate was restricted to just one victory from a total of four games. 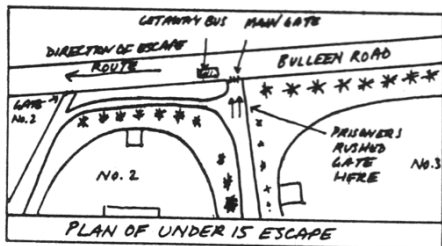

# PENINSULA SWAMPED

Since their tragic first round loss to the Hoers, the 15A's have been chafing at the proverbial bit to re-establish their reputation as an AGS force. The opportunity came on Saturday at Mt. Eliza, as the hapless Peninsula were given a football lesson by a team that has now earned the right to claim the traditional title of Eagle "Allstars". A title proudly borne by its Under 15A predecessors.

# SAINTS IN HEAVEN — EAGLES FLYING HIGH

There were emotional scenes at Moorabin on Saturday as St.Kilda finally broke through for their first win of the 1986 season. With a masterly display of football the Mighty Southern Saints demoralised their opponents to run out 5 point victors before an excitable crowd of eleven and a half thousand.

Meanwhile back at Bulleen, hardly anyone turned up to witness the big match on the No.2 Oval between the Eagle Allstars and the Toners. Following last week's convincing wipeout of Peninsula, a favourable result was expected for the home side - and so it came to pass as the Eagles produced an enterprising display of disciplined, play on football reminiscent of St.Kilda at its best. The return of Sap to this week's team was a bonus, but the interchange bench was severely weakened by the absence of Bobby (The Pizza Master) and his assistant Louy who had entered a team in the Annual Lygon Street 24 Hour Pizza and Pasta Marathon.

## TRINITY THWARTED
